



## BRIGHTON WRAP

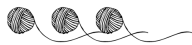

## DESIGN INFORMATION

The Brighton Wrap is a rectangular wrap featuring two delicate lace stitch patterns. Each half of the wrap is cast on separately, worked from the bottom edge to the center, and grafted together or joining method of your choice. The wrap can be customized to your desired length and width. Just know that your yarn requirements will change accordingly. Worked in crisp Cattail Silk, this lovely project will elevate any outfit.

## SKILL LEVEL



## FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

22" wide by 80" long

## YARN

Purl Soho Cattail Silk - Lace weight; 100% silk; 618 yards (565 meters) / 100 g (3.5 oz); 2 skeins, photographed in Blue Bamboo or 1236 yards of lace-weight yarn  
*Note: The sample used almost the entirety of the 2 skeins called for. I suggest purchasing a third skein to accommodate any variations in gauge. If you don't end up using the 3rd skein, you can return it/exchange it.*

## GAUGE

23 sts and 30 rows = 4" over Stockinette stitch, blocked

## NEEDLES

US 3 / 3.25mm 32" circular needles, or size to obtain gauge.

*Note: The wrap is worked back & forth in rows. Circular needles are used to accommodate the number of stitches for the wrap body.*

## TOOLS

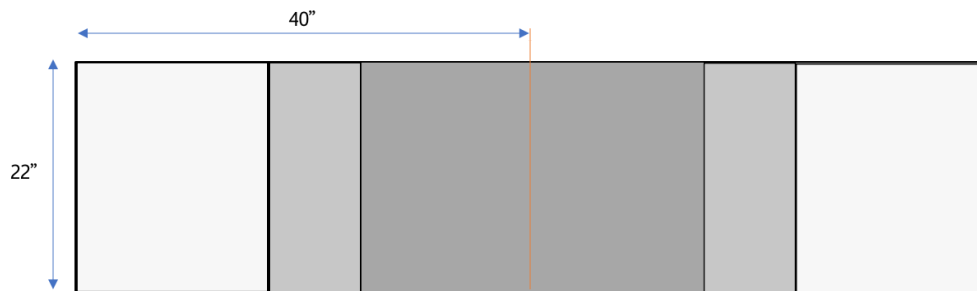
Tapestry needle, blocking wires, blocking pins, stitch markers (2).

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## SCHEMATIC

*Note: Schematic is approximate as the final size depends on how aggressively you block your wrap.*

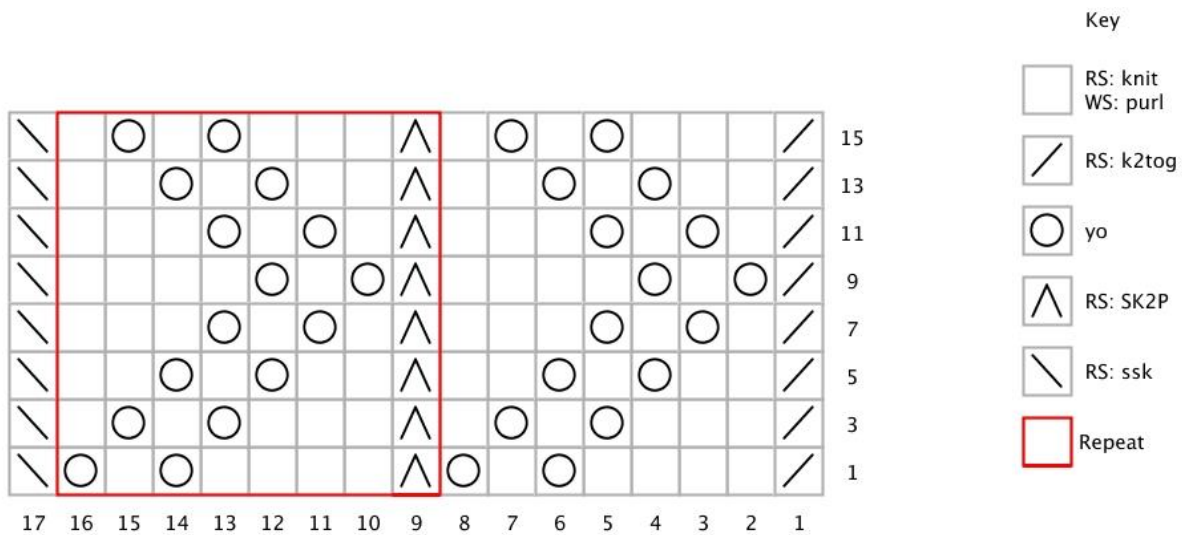


# STITCH PATTERNS

## CHART INSTRUCTIONS

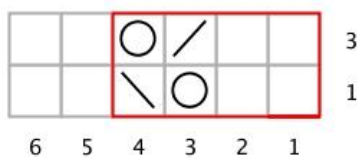
### VINE LACE STITCH

*Note: All WS rows are purled*



### COLUMN LACE STITCH

*Note: All WS rows are purled*



## WRITTEN INSTRUCTIONS

### VINE LACE STITCH

Row 1 (RS): K2tog, k4, yo, k1, yo, \*sk2p, k4, yo, k1, yo ; work from \* to 2 sts before marker, ssk.

Row 2 and all WS: Purl

Row 3: K2tog, k3, (yo, k1) × 2, \*sk2p, k3, (yo, k1) × 2 ; work from \*to 2 sts before marker, ssk.

Row 5: K2tog, k2, yo, k1, yo, k2, \*sk2p, k2, yo, k1, yo, k2 ; work from \* to 2 sts before marker, ssk.

Row 7: K2tog, (k1, yo) × 2, k3, \*sk2p, (k1, yo) × 2, k3 ; work from \* to 2 sts before marker, ssk.

Row 9: K2tog, yo, k1, yo, k4, \*sk2p, yo, k1, yo, k4 ; work from \*to 2 sts before marker, ssk.

Row 11: Same as Row 7

Row 13: Same as Row 5

Row 15: Same as Row 3

Row 16: Purl.

### COLUMN LACE STITCH

Row 1 (RS): \*K2, yo, ssk ; work from \* to 2 sts before marker, k2.

Row 2 (WS): Purl.

Row 3: \*K2, k2tog, yo ; work from \* to 2 sts before marker, k2.

Row 4: Purl.
